Beit Veit

Beit, signified by the dagesh, has the "b" sound.

Veit takes the "v" sound.

Alef
Silent letter.

Typically takes the sound of the vowel attached to it.

**Consonants: Yud** 


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Yud

Also affects vowel sounds.

Not hard "o" sound as in "bone." Softer almost resembling "aw."



**Consonants: Writing Mem** 






**Consonants: Hei** 

Hei

H as in "Halleluyah."
Is often silent at the end of words.
Note the separation of the "foot."

L as in "light."

T T


Tav

T sound as in "torah."

Is seen with and without dagesh. Will always get the "t" sound. In biblical days tav often received a softer "th" sound, thus words like Bethlehem.

Askenazi pronunciation give an "s" sound to the form without the dagesh.
